ARTISTIC DIRECTORS



DEBORAH HIRSCH

Now in her 9th season with the Houston Pride Band, Deborah Hirsch is originally from Baltimore, Maryland. She graduated from the University of Kansas with a bachelor's degree in music therapy and music education

and earned a master's degree in music at Texas A&M University-Commerce. She also served in the 312th Army Band in Lawrence, Kansas before moving to Texas.

Retiring after 37 years as a band director in Pasadena, Texas, Deborah enjoyed a successful career in public education. Ms. Hirsch was named "Teacher of the Year" in 2014.

As a participant the Colorado University Conducting Symposium in June 2016 Ms. Hirsch studied under Steve Davis, Dr. Donald McKinney, Dr. Matt Roeder and Dr. Matthew Dockendorf. In June 2019, she attended the Conn-Selmer Institute where she was able to study, consult and collaborate with many of her band idols—Dr. Tim Lautzenheiser, Dr. Paula A. Crider, Frank Troyka, Michael Sweeney and Richard Saucedo. In the 2019, Deborah was honored to direct the Association of Private Lutheran Schools Honor Band and the Texas Region 19 Class CC Band. In November 2021, she was the guest clinician for the Texas Region 19 CCC Band and shared the podium at the Bigger and Brighter Conference of the Pride Bands Alliance.

Deborah is an active clinician, judge, and consultant across the state and is a member of Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, Women Band Directors International, and Texas Music Adjudicators Association.

Ms. Hirsch is also a member of the chancel choir and bell choir at Bering Memorial United Church of Christ and a long time member of Pasadena Little Theater.

DAVID ALESCO

David Alesco (Lea) is in his ninth season with the Houston Pride Band and has served as Co-Artistic Director since 2018. During his tenure, he has conducted the ensemble at the 2022 Women Band Directors

International Conference as a featured concert and clinic ensemble and contributed to the Artistic Team for the 2021 Pride Bands Alliance national conference. He also represented HPB as a Reynolds Institute Conducting Fellow at the 2024 Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic and has appeared as a guest conductor for the Houston Chamber Music Society Wind Project. Committed to supporting living composers, David has helped commission multiple new works for the Houston Pride Band.

David is a founding member of BrassTax, the Houston Pride Band Brass Quintet, which serves as a musical ambassador for HPB's outreach initiatives. He has also been a frequent guest collaborator with Pride Chorus Houston.

Currently, David serves as Head Band Director and Fine Arts Department Chair at Null Middle School in Sheldon ISD. Under his leadership, his bands have achieved success at UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Evaluations and various festivals. As a private trumpet instructor, his students have earned Michigan All-State honors, superior ratings at regional and state solo & ensemble contests, and invitations to the Michigan Youth Arts Festival.

David holds bachelor's degrees in Psychology and Music Education from Texas A&M University and Michigan State University, respectively, and a Master of Music Education from the University of North Texas. In Fall 2025, he will begin his Doctorate in Wind Band Conducting at the UMKC Conservatory, studying with Steve Davis. His professional affiliations include the Texas Music Educators Association and the Texas Bandmasters Association.

PROCRAM NOTES COMPILED BY THEO HARRISON

TRES DANZAS DE MEXICO

Tres Danzas de Mexico is based on folk dance melodies from various provinces in Mexico. The setting utilizes many of the tone colors available in the modern symphonic band while retaining the characteristic flavor of Mexican music. This work comprises three distinct movements, each reflecting a unique dance style integral to Mexico's cultural heritage:

- EL PITAYERO the little whistler comes from the folk dance literature of Jalisco. This movement encapsulates the spirited essence of the Jarabe, inviting listeners to experience its joyous and celebratory nature.
- EL CAFE This movement reflects the elegance and grace of traditional Mexican dance, showcasing fluid melodies and harmonies that evoke the rich cultural heritage of the region. Origins of the lovely languid melody were not possible to determine
- EL CURRIPITI Is one of the brighter dances from Vera Cruz. This movement reflects the energetic and rhythmic characteristics of the Mexican Polka, highlighting the seamless fusion of European influences with native musical elements.

SOLAMENTE UNA VEZ

Solamente Una Vez, composed by Mexican songwriter Agustín Lara in 1941, is a timeless Latin-American classic that has enjoyed enduring popularity over the decades. Written in the Mexican bolero style, the song has been widely recorded, including versions with English lyrics under the title "You Belong to My Heart". This arrangement by Robert Longfield is expertly crafted using lush harmonies and varied scoring, bringing the colorful Mexican bolero style to concert programs.

SEIS MANUEL

Seis Manuel is the third movement of Shelley Hanson's four-movement suite, *Islas y Montañas* (Islands and Mountains). This piece draws inspiration from the traditional seis mapeyé, a song and dance form integral to the Jíbaro people, who are peasant farmers residing in Puerto Rico's mountainous regions. The title, Seis Manuel, follows the Puerto Rican custom of naming a seis after someone important to its creation, further

grounding the piece in cultural authenticity. The seis is characterized by a recurring harmonic pattern over which singers improvise melodies, reflecting the rich cultural heritage of Puerto Rico. In Seis Manuel, Hanson incorporates this traditional structure, allowing the music to embody the improvisational spirit of the seis.

LA VIRGEN DE LA MACARENA

La Virgen de la Macarena is a famous Spanish pasodoble that has become a staple in the trumpet solo repertoire. Traditionally associated with bullfighting, this bold and dramatic piece is named after the Virgin of Hope of Macarena, a revered figure in Seville, Spain. La Virgen de la Macarena is the favorite Virgin of Sevilla, Spain, where the Basilica Macarena has an ornately beautiful statue of her likeness on display, complete with crystal tears falling down her face. Also called La Esperanza, she is also considered the protector of bullfighters. The composition features a majestic and triumphant melody, punctuated by virtuosic trumpet flourishes and vibrant rhythms that evoke the excitement of the bullring. Over the years, La Virgen de la Macarena has been performed by legendary trumpeters and remains a thrilling showcase of technical brilliance and Spanish musical heritage.

DANZÓN NO. 2

Danzón No. 2 is one of the most celebrated works by Mexican composer Arturo Márquez. Inspired by the traditional danzón, a Cuban dance form that became popular in Mexico, this piece captures both the elegance and fiery passion of the genre. Márquez masterfully weaves expressive melodies, rhythmic intensity, and lush orchestration to create a work that is both intimate and exhilarating. The piece begins with a sultry, seductive theme before building into a vibrant, energetic climax, evoking the grace and excitement of dancers moving across the floor. Danzón No. 2 has become a staple of modern concert repertoire, enchanting audiences with its rich textures and dynamic contrasts.

DON RICARDO

Don Ricardo, composed by Gabriel Musella, is a vibrant and heartfelt tribute that blends rich harmonies, energetic rhythms, and lyrical melodies into a piece full of character and warmth. With influences from

traditional Mexican and Latin American music, the work captures a sense of celebration and cultural pride. The piece showcases dynamic contrasts, from bold, spirited sections to moments of lyrical beauty, making it an engaging and expressive work for both performers and audiences. **Don Ricardo** stands as a testament to Musella's ability to create music that is both evocative and deeply rooted in tradition.

OBLIVION

Oblivion, composed by Argentine tango master Astor Piazzolla, is a hauntingly beautiful and deeply emotional piece that showcases his signature nuevo tango style. Originally written for the 1984 film *Enrico IV*, the piece transcends its cinematic origins to stand as one of Piazzolla's most evocative works. Its melancholic melody, featured in the solo flute and oboe, unfolds with a sense of longing and nostalgia, supported by lush harmonies and a slow, expressive tango rhythm. **Oblivion** captures the essence of bittersweet remembrance, drawing listeners into its hypnotic and introspective mood, making it a favorite for soloists and ensembles alike.

PROUD OF ME

Proud of Me is an uplifting and dynamic composition by Michele Fernández, commissioned by and dedicated to the South Florida Pride Youth Band. The piece features a multicultural flair with a disco influence, based on the chord progression of "Over the Rainbow," symbolizing that every young person can "fly." Its mood is both uplifting and triumphant, offering a rhythmic groove that motivates players and listeners alike to move and dance. This work showcases Fernández's ability to blend iconic grooves with Afro-Latin hints, resulting in soaring, happy melodies and catchy motifs that inspire joy and celebration.

DESPACITO

Despacito became a global sensation upon its release in 2017, blending Latin pop with reggaeton rhythms to create an infectious and unforgettable hit. Originally performed by Puerto Rican singer Luis Fonsi and featuring Daddy Yankee, the song was later remixed with Justin Bieber, propelling it to worldwide success. This band transcription captures the song's signature smooth melodies, rhythmic drive, and vibrant energy, bringing its Latin flair to the concert stage.

DE COLORES

De Colores, meaning "Of Colors," is a traditional Mexican folk song that has been cherished for generations. Often associated with celebrations and the arrival of spring, the song paints a vivid picture of the vibrant colors found in nature. David Marlatt's arrangement captures the simple elegance of this waltz.

OYE COMO VA

Oye Como Va, composed by Latin jazz and mambo legend Tito Puente in 1963, is a classic piece that has significantly influenced Latin music. The song gained widespread popularity in 1970 through Santana's electrifying rendition, which infused it with a rock sensibility, introducing it to a broader audience. Michael Brown's arrangement captures the infectious Latin groove that makes **Oye Como Va** a perennial favorite. The arrangement prominently features the percussion section, allowing them to showcase the characteristic Latin rhythms that drive the piece.

SELECTIONS FROM ENCANTO

Disney's Encanto captivated audiences with its vibrant animation, heartfelt storytelling, and unforgettable music by Lin-Manuel Miranda. This exciting band medley brings to life some of the film's biggest hits, including the chart-topping "We Don't Talk About Bruno", the uplifting "The Family Madrigal", and the powerful "Surface Pressure", among others. Filled with rhythmic energy, rich harmonies, and catchy melodies, this arrangement captures the magic and emotion of the Madrigal family's journey.

ADRIANA LARUE, GUEST EMCEE

One of Houston's top drag entertainers, known as "Houston's Baddest Diva," Adriana LaRue is a beautiful transgender woman who participates in the art form of drag! She is a part of one of the most diverse and talented drag families in Texas. With unconditional love for the community, she is a pillar and strong advocate for trans rights and issues. When you come to one of her shows, you never know what you might see or hear. She is the definition of a Texas showgirl. She is the queen on the scene, commanding every stage she steps on with charisma, uniqueness, nerve, and talent that leaves audiences gagging for more.



SAMARA A. MARTINEZ, GUEST PERFORMER

Samara A. Martinez is the Mariachi Director at Humble Independent School District (ISD), a position she has held since the fall of 2020. With a deep passion for music and mariachi, she has dedicated her career to inspiring young musicians and preserving the rich tradition of mariachi music.

Before her role at Humble ISD, Samara was a music teacher at Houston ISD, where she led programs in general music, violin, choir, and mariachi. A graduate of the prestigious High School for the Performing and Visual Arts (HSPVA) class of 2007, she went on to earn her Bachelor's degree in Music Education from Stephen F. Austin State

University in 2016.

In addition to her educational career, Samara is the co-founder of **Mariachi Amor a México**, the first all-female mariachi group in Houston, Texas. Through her work with the ensemble, she has made a significant impact on the local mariachi scene, highlighting the importance of gender representation in this traditionally male-dominated genre.

With a deep commitment to both music and community, Samara continues to foster the growth of mariachi music in the next generation, ensuring that the traditions and cultural significance of this vibrant art form remain strong for years to come.





GABE MUSELLA, GUEST CONDUCTOR

Gabe Musella serves as UIL Assistant Music Director in Austin, Texas. Prior to his current position he taught for 30 years in Texas where his bands earned UIL Sweepstakes Awards in 8 different Varsity and Non-Varsity categories, performed at The Midwest Clinic and MFA National Concert Festival, and placed as finalists in TMEA Honor Band and at the UIL State Marching Contest. While at Spring HS, the band program was designated a Grammy Signature School, a Houston Symphony Orchestra Residency School, and was featured in THE INSTRUMENTALIST. Spring Band ensembles earned five invitations to perform at The Midwest Clinic between 2008 and 2016, and Spring chamber groups received awards at the prestigious Fischoff, Coltman, and other chamber music competitions.

Mr. Musella is an active composer and arranger whose works for band, choir, jazz ensemble, orchestra, percussion, and chamber ensembles have been performed at The Midwest Clinic, PASIC, WIBC, the Music For All National Festival, TMEA, TBA, and other conferences throughout the country and abroad. The Texas Tech Goin' Band from Raiderland performed "Wreck 'Em Fanfare" at the 2023 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, and his works have been premiered by The United States Air Force Band, the TMEA All State Jazz Ensemble, the ATSSB All State Band, and ensembles at the University of Texas-El Paso, Texas Tech University, and the University of Houston. His publishers include RBC, C. Alan, Boosey & Hawkes, Carl Fischer, Kjos, Row-Loff, TRN, ALRY, and MKT Music Publications.

Gabe received the Meritorious Achievement Award from The Texas Bandmasters Association and the Specs Excellence in Music Education Award from The Houston Symphony Orchestra. He holds a BM in Composition and a MM in Conducting, both from Texas Tech University where he studied with James Sudduth, Keith Bearden, and Mary Jeane van Appledorn. He is grateful to mentors Tom Bennett, Eddie Green, Philip Geiger, Rodney Klett, Joe Dixon, Rick Lambrecht, Kenny Capshaw, Richard Crain, James Edwards, Randy Vaughn, Rick Ghinelli, Mike Warny, and Scott McAdow. His memberships include ASCAP, ABA, TMEA, TBA, TMAA, Phi Beta Mu, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and he serves as Chamber Coordinator for the Music For All National Concert Festival. He is currently President of the Foundation for Music Education, and he has been on the staff of the Texas Tech Band and Orchestra Camp since 1985. Gabe and his wife, Alice, are very proud of their son Alex, who has earned degrees from Texas A & M – Corpus Christi and Sam Houston State University.

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
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our story

The Houston Pride Band has a proud history spanning over four decades. Originally known as the Montrose Marching Band, the organization was formed by a small group of musicians in 1978 as a way to make new friends and to provide entertainment for Houston's gay and lesbian community.
